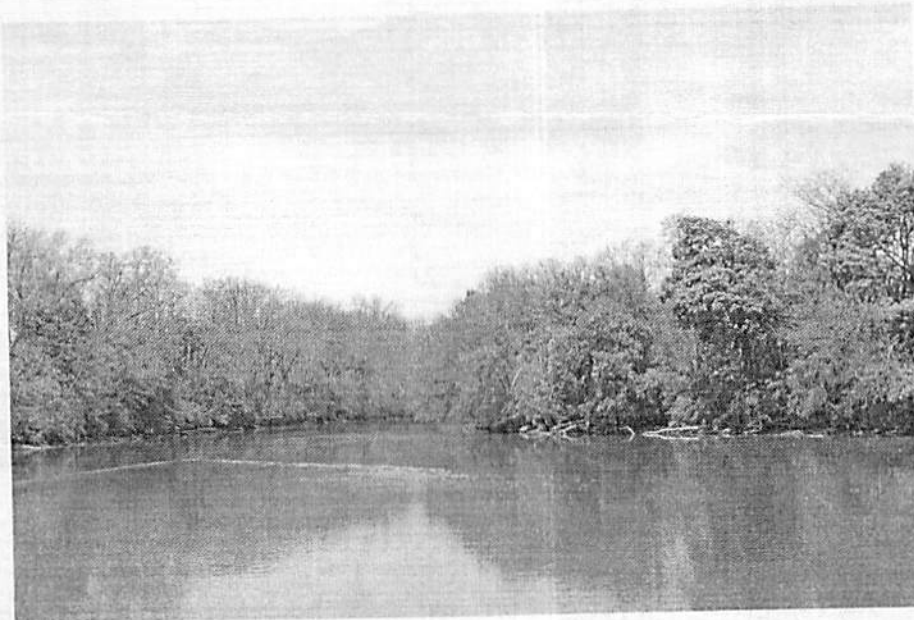
**IMPORTANT BOARD MEETING

The Grant County Historical Society held its Annual Meeting on Wednesday, April 15, at the Sunnycrest United Methodist Church. A total of 50 were in attendance for the program, "Walking a Myaamia Trail Near the Mississinewa River," presented by George Ironstrack, Assistant Director in the Education and Outreach Office, Myaamia Center, Miami University.

The speaker, a citizen of the Miami Tribe of Oklahoma, has been a student of the Miami language since the 1990s. To begin the program, he spoke briefly and fluently in his native language, and he then reviewed Miami history along the Mississinewa River.

The presentation concluded with a variety of questions from the audience, and many expressed appreciation for gaining an increase in knowledge and understanding.
